A: Mr. Janak Mehta has the unique distinction of making original contribution to set up various organizations in the field of quality management in India and at the international level as follows:

1. 1983: Pioneered the quality initiative in India through Association of Indian Engineering Industries (AIEI) now known as Confederation of Indian Industries (CII) as the Chairman of Engineering Services Committee.
2. 1988: Founded the TQM Division of CII now known as CII - Institute of Quality as Advisor to CII until 1992.
3. 1992: Recommended the structure of Quality Council of India (QCI) as the only industry member of the Task Force set up by the Government of India. This was set up as a national body for quality, standardization and Conformity Assessment. Currently serving as the member of the Council and the Governing Body and also Chairman of the International Affairs Committee.
4. 1992: Set up TQM International Private Limited (TQMI) that has become the premium organization in the field of quality management in India. Currently serving as Chairman and Managing Director.
5. 1996: Set up Indian Society for Quality (ISQ) an organization of Quality Professionals in India as founding President. Currently continuing as the member of the Governing Body.
6. 2000: Set up T4T Consultants Pvt. Ltd, providing quality management related services in the Middle East. Currently serving as Chairman.
7. 2002: One of the seven original members to form the Asian Network for Quality (ANQ) in Tokyo. Member of the Board of Directors from inception. Currently serving as the Chairperson.
8. 2008: Became the only member from India as an Academician of International Academy for Quality (IAQ) the world's apex body of professionals from the field of quality management. Currently serving as Board Director since 2009 and Chair of the 'Think Tank on Quality in Education'.
9. 2010: Set up Total Human Energy Foundation (THE) for improving quality in school education. Currently serving as Chairman.

Except TQMI and T4T all the rest are not for profit organizations.

B. He has closely worked with and / or set up collaboration with various organizations from around the world. A few are stated as follows:

1. 1982: Visited JUSE and used the inputs from there to start the CII's quality initiative
2. 1987: Introduced Juran Institute to India through AIEI now CII
3. 1988: Introduced Batalas Limited, UK through CII to conduct the first set of QMS Lead auditor training programs in India.

4. 1988: Established collaboration between Japanese Union of Scientists and Engineers (JUSE) and CII to conduct programs for Top Management Study Missions to Japan and for quality professionals in India. Personally led three TQM Study Missions to Japan from 1989-1991
5. 1989: Led the first TQM Study Mission to USA on behalf of CII to study Malcolm Baldrige Award winning companies.
6. 1989: Took a team of 12 senior executives from various industries to attend Deming Seminar in London
7. 1990: Introduced BVQI for ISO 9000 certification audits for the first three companies in India and was involved as a member of the audit team.
8. 1990: Got first batch of auditors from CII registered with International Register of Certificated Auditors (IRCA), UK.
9. 1991: Became a member of Institute of Quality Assurance (IQA), UK; currently known as Chartered Quality Institute (CQI). Remained a member till 2000.
10. 1991: Was invited as technical expert by ISO TC-176 Committee for the development of quality management systems. Attended meeting for 4 years in a row.
11. 1991: Introduced RWTUV, Germany to conduct first set of ISO 9000 audits in India
12. 1992: Established collaboration between RWTUV and TQMI for offering 4 week certificate courses as 'Certified Quality Engineer' in India
13. 1992: Established collaboration between British Standards Institution (BSI) and TQMI for offering various registered courses on Quality Management Systems in India.
14. 1993: Became a member of American Society for Quality (ASQ) and established a relationship with India
15. 1993: Became a member of European Organization for Quality (EOQ) and established a relationship with India.
16. 1995: Established collaboration between Westinghouse productivity and Quality Center and TQMI for offering services in TQM, Baldrige assessment, Customer Value management and Business Process Reengineering. Was valid till 2000.
17. 1996: Got TQMI to be the first registered company in India with IRCA, UK for offering QMS Lead auditor and auditor training courses.
18. 1998: Established relationship with Multiface Inc., USA for process improvement in India.
19. 2000: Established a relationship with Komatsu Career Creation Ltd. and TQMI offering Daily Management, Policy Management and Lean services to Indian industry. Organized 6 TQM/TPM/TPS Study Missions to Japan for the senior executives from industry
20. 2001: Established relationship between Bluefire Partners, USA and TQMI for Six Sigma Training and consultancy. Lasted till 2003

21. Through Asian Network for Quality (ANQ) established a long term relationship between ISQ and various national member bodies from Japan, Taiwan, Korea, China, Singapore, Thailand. Pakistan, Bangla Desh, Nepal etc.

22. 2003: Established collaboration between Motorola University, USA and TQMI for six sigma training and consultancy services in India

This is after 25 years of service in industrial organizations in various capacities culminating as the Chief Executive.
